35 Years in DA (with a break of 10)

While leaving an AA meeting--sober for a year--I passed by about 8 people pulling messy stacks of papers from their shopping bags and spreading them out on a conference table. I soon found out it was a Debtors Anonymous meeting, so I attended the next meeting. As with the others, I brought all my unopened, terrifying mail (and orange peelings and gum wrappers) to the meeting, and after the standard format, we spent a couple of hours working on our paperwork together. It was the only meeting in Boston, but I had heard that NYC had strong meetings and finally made it to the Friday night meeting in the Village, found a sponsor and back in Boston I got a job for twice the salary. Soon, I began attending three and four meetings a week and even started one in Harvard Square.

After meeting the woman (in DA) with whom I began living for a decade, we applied DA to our finances with the unsteady income of two free-lance as artists.. Overtime, I stopped pulling my share of the load, depressed clinically I think now, or I was out of love and too codependent to leave. She came into some money with which we fulfilled many visions: we toured the British Isles; studied Tibetan Buddhism in California; went to London to study shamanism; went to house-building school in Maine; bought sports parkas and wicking tops. But we did not save.

Finally, she met someone new. Devastated, I went to my mother's in Washington State and became her night nurse; she was very ill and died a year later. Meanwhile, my friend G moved to New York and I planned to move there, too.

But my brother didn't pay me the agreed upon \$5,000 for 5 months' work. With the help of my mother's housekeeper, I got the money with my mother's consent, out of the bank, and flew to New York. I got a job, a place, and when the money ran out, took a loan from an old friend who declined my check. I continued to attend the Friday night Business Owners' meeting (BDA) which comprises of two back-to-back meetings and, even when I got evicted and became homeless, my shelter was steps from a daily DA meeting.

Eventually, I went to live in assisted living where I was very unhappy, and after a stint in a psychiatric ward, I made my own world thanks to my electronic gadgets which included a computer, a printer, a cell phone, and a tv. I obtained a subsidized apartment and I am here now for a heavenly three years. For two years I spent less than my Social Security, but when I got hooked by online shopping, I bounced seven checks and my AA sponsor "bounced" me back to DA.

Now, I am mostly clear about my money. I go to DA every Friday waving to The Lady of Liberty on the BQE, love having reunions with old friends, and as a writer feel today called to use my words. We DA is where you go to grow up! When you "polish it" here, a miracle occurs "there!" Pay your own way comfortably. Live abundantly. Da's beyond your wildest dreams. Try it! Or just come back. We'll save you a seat. The end--or should I say, the beginning
